### What is the I-SAT?

- A program-level assessment for early childhood education and care programs in the state of Indiana.
- The I-SAT comprises seven (7) standards with a total of 50 quality items utilizing a rubric-based developmental continuum that offers a roadmap for advancing program quality from "Beginning" to "Excelling".
- The I-SAT quality continuum includes specific behaviors, benchmarks, and ultimately a scope and sequence a program can utilize to create a plan to improve quality.



#### What is the I-SAT?

- There are four (4) versions of the I-SAT, one for each program type with questions tailored for each:
  - Center-Based
  - Family Child Care Homes
  - Ministries
  - School-Based

#### Family Child Care I-SAT Program Assessment

Implementation Questions Aligned to PTQ and NAFCC Accreditation (0-5 Scale Scoring)

Each quality item includes a continuum of five (5) evidence that stack upon each other. Unless otherwise denoted with an Asterix (\*), you must complete 1 before responding 2 and complete 2 before responding 3, and so on.

## Who should complete the I-SAT?

- The I-SAT is designed to be completed by the leader or leaders of a program.
- SPARK follows up with the program leader to discuss results and create a customized support plan.



### How long does the I-SAT take?

- The I-SAT is customizable, allowing program leaders to assess using all seven (7) standards and 50 quality items or only those that are of greatest interest.
- Depending on how many quality items you want to use to assess your program, most programs complete the I-SAT in 30 minutes to an hour.



# How does the I-SAT work with other recognition programs, like Paths to QUALITY?

- The I-SAT is designed to support programs along their quality improvement journey, including participation in Paths to QUALITY.
- The I-SAT is <u>NOT</u> intended to replace the Paths to QUALITY standards.



# What happens after completion of the I-SAT?

- After completing the I-SAT, program leaders have the opportunity to reflect on the assessment data, identify relevant areas of development and access SPARK Learning Lab's Knowledge Center to assist the program in achieving quality improvement goals.
- Within a week of submitting the I-SAT, programs are contacted by SPARK Learning Lab to discuss and jointly agree upon an identified area of development.

# How often can the I-SAT be completed?

- The I-SAT can be used to assess an early childhood education and care program as often and as many times as the program leader(s) deem necessary.
- You choose which sections and quality items to complete.



### **I-SAT Standards**

- The I-SAT standards are directly aligned to Indiana's Core Knowledge and Competencies (CKC's) for Early Childhood, School-Age, and Youth Professionals.
- The seven CKCs make up the seven program quality standards in the I-SAT.

- 1. Child and Youth Growth and Development
- 2. Health, Safety and Nutrition
- 3. Observation and Assessment
- 4. Learning Environment and Curriculum
- 5. Family and Community Engagement
- 6. Leadership and Professionalism
- 7. Organizational Development and Administration



# I-SAT Quality Items & Continuum

- Each quality standard includes at least one to several quality items.
- Each quality item includes a continuum of five (5) benchmarks that stack upon each other, unless otherwise noted.
- Each quality item has a continuum of benchmarks grouped into five (5) categories: Beginning, Developing, Emerging, Mastering, or Excelling.

Lead Educator/ Caregiver and any Assistant(s) use the Early Learning FOUNDATIONS to implement responsive curriculum and learning environments.	Lead Educator/ Caregiver educates families on the Early Learning FOUNDATIONS, when applicable, and uses when discussing the individual child's development.





## Next Steps After I-SAT Submission







#### Connection from SPARK

- Attempt to contact by phone and email
- Discuss I-SAT responses and jointly agree upon an identified area of development
- When determined, the program leaders receive a curated set of Tier 1, Tier 2, or Tier 3 services to assist in their quality improvement journey
- One tier of service is assigned to a program that may inevitably incorporate multiple goals
- The determination of Tier of Services is part of the curated list provided by the SPARK Support Team to the program




