Old Business – Mandatory Training Recommendations

Explore changing the annual CPR requirement, as the certification is valid for 2 years

Offer Universal Precautions as an on demand training Explore the possibility of allowing directors to participate in a "train the trainer" model for Universal Precautions

SPARK will share this recommendation with licensing partners. An on demand Universal Precautions training is currently in development! SPARK will share this recommendation with the Office of Early Childhood and Out-of-School Learning.



Old Business – Regulatory Barrier Recommendations

Consider how SPARK can serve as a bridge between providers and other system partners

> RACs and providers can continue to use SPARK as a conduit to connect to other system partners.

Further exploration will be needed to establish any type of ongoing, formal platform for providers to voice concerns. Explore the possibility of police agencies or local businesses providing fingerprinting

> SPARK is discussing this possibility with partners.

Provide learning forums or discussion boards for providers to discuss what they are doing to address regulatory barriers

> SPARK is exploring how to best provide opportunities for providers to connect with peers about this topic.



Old Business – COVID-19 Related Recommendations

Provide opportunities for programs to discuss resources they have found to secure necessary materials (PPE, cleaning supplies)

> SPARK is exploring how best to establish platforms for providers to share these resources.



Old Business – PTQ Rating Procedure Recommendations

Tailor reminder emails to include resources needed for individual programs

> SPARK is exploring how to best tailor the messaging included in these emails.



Old Business – Help Desk Recommendations

Create a FAQ document that includes the top ten questions the Help Desk receives Share data with RACs about the number of calls that require additional follow-up support

SPARK is developing this resource and will post it to the website.

SPARK will share this data with the RAC at a future meeting.

- Launched phase 1 in April 2020

How does the I-SAT work with other recognition programs, like Paths to QUALITY?

- The I-SAT is designed to support programs along their quality improvement journey, including participation in Paths to QUALITY.
- The I-SAT is <u>NOT</u> intended to replace the Paths to QUALITY standards.



I-SAT Standards

- The I-SAT standards are directly aligned to Indiana's Core
 Knowledge and Competencies
 (CKC's) for Early Childhood,
 School-Age, and Youth
 Professionals.
- The seven CKCs make up the seven program quality standards in the I-SAT.

- 1. Child and Youth Growth and Development
- 2. Health, Safety and Nutrition
- 3. Observation and Assessment
- 4. Learning Environment and Curriculum
- 5. Family and Community Engagement
- 6. Leadership and Professionalism
- 7. Organizational Development and Administration



I-SAT Quality Items & Continuum

- Each quality standard includes at least one to several quality items.
- Each quality item includes a continuum of five (5) benchmarks that stack upon each other, unless otherwise noted.
- Each quality item has a continuum of benchmarks grouped into five (5) categories: Beginning, Developing, Emerging, Mastering, or Excelling.
