- b. SPARK Professional Development Survey:
  - i. SPARK shared an overview of the recent professional development survey administered from August 23 thru September 9, 2022. The objective of the survey was to gather feedback to prioritize the content created to meet the most pressing needs, including educator preferences on modalities and availability of professional development and peer-to-peer networking opportunities. The primary audience for the survey was early education and care program leaders, program teachers and caregiving staff, and early care and education system partners.
  - ii. RAC Members engaged in the following discussion questions:



- 1. What would encourage you and your program staff to attend in-person training events?
  - a. Suggestions to encourage in-person attendance:
    - i. Provide staff coverage to take sessions in the day
    - ii. offer small incentives
    - iii. offer trainings at the providers/programs location
- 2. What would help educators feel more comfortable with having mental health and wellness support onsite in your program or classroom?
  - a. It is important to lead by example
- 3. What mental health and wellness support or approaches have you used with yourself or with your staff that you found impactful?
  - a. Giving team members a moment out of the classroom
  - b. When determining an approach, start with something you can implement immediately.
- c. Indiana Self-Assessment Tool (I-SAT) Relaunch
  - i. The I-SAT is a program-level assessment for Indiana's early childhood education and care programs. The I-SAT includes a quality continuum that includes specific behaviors, benchmarks, and, ultimately, a scope and sequence a program can utilize to improve quality. Based on early care and education program feedback, SPARK has worked to revise and relaunch the assessment to better support program leaders in pursuing continuous quality improvement.
  - ii. SPARK is rebranding the I-SAT to be more approachable and inviting.
    - 1. Should a name be considered that would not/could not be made as an acronym?
      - a. Not an acronym. You don't always know what it means when it is an acronym used.
      - b. Providers will turn it into an acronym whether it is named with an acronym or not.
      - c. Need something we can remember immediately and doesn't bring a scary connotation like the SAT.
      - d. If using an acronym, have it spell a word.
    - 2. Should "assessment" be included in the name of the tool? Discuss pros and cons.
      - a. The name of the tool should be descriptive of what it is. Is it an analysis process or an assessment tool?
      - b. It should be a fun, catchy name
      - c. The word assessment seems like extra work.
